"The children have been very engaged in Busy Fingers this week, squeezing and crushing cooked potatoes and carrots. This has been a sensory experience providing the opportunity to describe how it feels. For the Christmas Tree Festival at St John's Church in Boxmoor, each child has been working with our student placement to create their own clay decoration. They have been collecting leaves and then rolling and imprinting onto clay. Please go along to the Tree Festival and see if your child can spot their decoration (details on the last page of this newsletter). Also, this week the story of 'The Gruffalo' has been brought to life by re-enacting the story and role playing the different characters. The children also thought of their own questions to interview the 'Gruffalo', there were some interesting questions including "Why are your eyes orange?, "Why do you have terrible teeth?".

Keypersons will explicitly introduce the words to their groups then all staff in the room will be use these words throughout the sessions each day

Please look out for the words in each newsletter and support your child by:

- asking your child about these words
- using these words at home in your conversations (where possible!)

Regular exposure to these words at home and at school will maximise the chances of the words being understood and / or used by your child.

Curriculum - Why we do what we do - The World What we do at school:

We are so fortunate with our expansive outdoor space that we can encourage our children to explore the natural world, experience different weather conditions and appreciate all living things. We provide high quality welly boots and waterproofs so that children can safely access outdoors in all weathers. Our outdoor space allows children to foster a curiosity about their natural surroundings and take part in growing plants and vegetables. We teach them to identify birds, trees, minibeasts and small animals and provide experiences across the year to give first hand experiences of watching animals and insects grow such as ducklings/chicks from eggs or butterflies from caterpillars.

How you can help at home:

- Grow a plant/vegetable from a seed and discuss what that seed needs and what happens when it grows.
- Take your child for walks outside/through woods/along the canal. Look out for different plants/birds/wildlife.
- Experience and discuss different types of weather put on wellies and go splashing in puddles!


- A huge 'Thank You!' to all of our volunteers for generously giving up their time to wrap up the gifts ready for Santa's visit.
